

Notice to Parents - Child Impact Program

All parents of minor children involved in a divorce/parenting case are required by law to take a four-hour Child Impact Program (CIP) within 45 days of the petition being served on the respondent (RSA 458-D). This is a course on how to help children deal with the issues surrounding divorce, separation, and the allocation of parental rights and responsibilities.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, NH Child Impact Program providers will offer live web-based classes instead of "in-person" classes. (NOTE: Live "in person" classes may be available to parents unable to attend a web-based class.)
