ORDER

The purpose of this Order is to make the parties and counsel aware that approximately four and half years ago, the undersigned represented the Department of Education and answered to then Attorney General MacDonald, at the Department of Justice. Additionally, the undersigned has had recent conversations with Justice MacDonald about the needs of the New Hampshire Circuit Court. Finally, the undersigned's children attended school with the parties' minor child, attended at least one social event outside of the school with the parties' minor child and the undersigned is aware that we have common friends.

Rule 2.11 of the Code of Judicial Conduct (Supreme Court Rule 38) requires a judge to disqualify herself in several stated situations in a proceeding in which the judge's impartiality might reasonably be questioned. While the undersigned judicial officer believes she can and will decide the case impartially based upon the facts and the applicable law, the past professional involvement and current overlap of acquaintances could cause a reasonable person to question the undersigned's impartiality.

If either party believes that the undersigned judicial officer should not participate in this case, the party is directed to file a Motion for Recusal as soon as possible in accordance with Circuit Court Family Division Rule 1.10.

The Court grants the Assented to Motion to Continue but declines to rule on any substantive pleadings until addressing potential conflicts with the parties.
